## **Management Committee Chair Report**

As I stand before you to give my Chair report at our 2022 AGM. I am reflecting on the year we have all had. The theme of COURAGE, LOVE and TRUTH as HEALING resonates strongly with my experience. From pandemics to natural disasters to international conflicts it seems we are all being called upon to bring these qualities to the foreground.

The current pandemic has challenged many of us to find new ways of working together. Many of us have either had COVID or know someone who has. Some of us have been forced to make difficult choices to navigate the current mandates or have endured being separated from loved ones and some of us have had loved ones pass over. And some of us have had to rebuild our communities after natural disasters have decimated our communities.

Not one of us has been left unaffected over the last couple of years.

Therefore we see this as future work and look forward to sharing ideas and proposals over the year ahead.
