Presenters: priests

Elke Baublies (Hawkes Bay, NZ) – Elke is a retired priest living in Hawkes Bay who has worked in Britain, Germany and for many years in New Zealand. Elke is active visiting congregations in NZ throughout the year with a special interest in human beings consecration of nature and the elemental world.

Hartmut Borries (Auckland, NZ) – Hartmut has explored religious themes in online talks “Lockdown Pilgrimage” during covid restrictions and has also been giving talks at monthly retreat gatherings in NZ on ‘The Priesthood of All’. He visits and works in all of the congregations in NZ.

Darryl Coonan (Melbourne, AU) – Having worked as a nurse, counsellor and psychotherapist while a member of the Melbourne congregation, Darryl enrolled in the North American Seminary of The Christian Community and was ordained in 2012. He has since worked in Boston USA, Auckland NZ, and Canberra. Now he is a retired priest and is also employed as a psychotherapist part-time in a Melbourne hospital.

Lisa Devine (Sydney, AU). Lisa has a Masters in Psychology and has worked with at-risk youth and their families. She works as a Chaplain/ Counsellor in three Steiner schools and teaches at the Sydney Rudolf Steiner College and is a trained eurythmist. For many years Lisa has facilitated proseminary training in Australia. Her presentations are appreciated by a broad audience.

Damien Gilroy (Adelaide, AU) – Damien was ordained in Toronto Canada in May 2022. He has been a class teacher in Steiner Schools in Melbourne, Canberra and Adelaide with an equally long-term involvement in congregations of The Christian Community. Damien has trained in in Speech Formation.

Cheryl Nekvapil (Melbourne, AU) – Currently, Cheryl is the co-ordinating priest (lenker) for Australia-New Zealand. During 2022 she facilitates study groups online and in-person, as well as workshops, exploring the religious ground of Christianity. Cheryl is a chaplain in a number of Steiner Schools working with parents, students and staff.

Ioanna Panagiotopoulos (Canberra, AU) -- Reverend Ioanna Panagiotopoulos is a priest of The Christian Community. She spent many years performing and teaching Speech Formation and Michael Chekhov acting technique. Ioanna is the Canberra priest, teaching Speech & Drama in Canberra, and is Chaplain for The Alpine School, Cooma NSW

Veronika Plantener (Melbourne, AU) – Having worked in Vienna, Veronika was sent to Melbourne 15 years ago. Currently she works as Chaplain at the Ballarat School. Her focus in the congregation is on religious activities for children and families including festivals, online study for younger adults and looking at ways to reach out to older people.

Cheryl Prigg (Auckland, NZ) -- Cheryl was a Waldorf teacher for many years, has a Masters of Education and a particular interest in curriculum design. When her final class graduated to high school, Cheryl studied at The Christian Community Seminary in the United States and was ordained in 2019. She lives in Auckland and enjoys working in all 4 New Zealand communities.

Oliver Steinrueck (Oberlenker, Berlin, Germany) -- Oliver served as a congregational priest for many years in the USA, and was also the lenker (co-ordinating priest) there for 15 years. Since 2019 Oliver is one of the three oberlenkers in the leadership of Christian Community priests based in Berlin. He is the link person there for our Australia-NZ Region and this is his first visit to Australia to meet with us here.

Lesley Waite (Wellington, NZ) -- Lesley was ordained in 2021 to support the work of fellow priests in New Zealand. She has had much experience in the Waldorf educational sector in NZ, and received the conferment of a Master of Philosophy (MPhil) in Education. Lesley is based in the affiliate community of Wellington and travels to celebrate in our NZ congregations.
