## **About the Lecture**

"Is there a Difference Between Christian and Pre Christian Love?"

This lecture is a sequel to the previous one Johannes gave on Easter Sunday 2022, which looked at the cosmic significance of Christ's death and resurrection. The key to our understanding of these events lies in our understanding of the "Resurrection Body", through which Christ established the universal template of overcoming death, potentially reversing the "fall out of paradise" for anyone choosing to follow his example.

In this second lecture, Johannes will continue with the question of the Resurrection Body of Christ, putting it into context with past and present spiritual streams as well as current world events. We are in the midst of the age of Michael while at the same time in the midst of a worldwide war between Good and Evil. For a positive outcome much depends on whether a sufficiently large portion of humanity is able to wake up to the lies of the past, the dangers of the present, as well as the new future possibilities arising from the slow-motion collapse of the old world order.
