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Peggy Day-Hakker is the Pedagogical Section Coordinator for Australia. Peggy first began teaching at Glenaeon Rudolf Steiner School in Sydney in 1980 where she worked in the kindergarten and pre-school and contributed to class teaching for 17 years. In 1998, she began writing the re-accreditation of the Advanced Diploma of Rudolf Steiner Education in Sydney and then taking over as coordinator of the course at Glenaeon. Here she tutored in Kindergarten Studies, Festivals, Fairy tales and Storytelling as well as Steiner Pedagogy, Life Phases and Biography. In 2010 she began work as the lead writer of the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework. This involved writing core subjects for Kindergarten to Class 6 and supporting the writing of the Arts, Health and PE and Technologies.

Currently, Peggy also works part-time with SEA in the areas of curriculum development and support, promoting Anthroposophical Study, Reconciliation, liaising with Home-schooling families and supporting integration of Trauma informed practices.
