A Creative Life with Judith Clingan OAM

Judy Clingan will take you on a roller coaster trip spanning ten seven-year cycles.....illustrated with recordings and projections, her presentation will explore the artistic richness of a financially impoverished childhood, through many mis-steps which eventually led to a wonderfully rewarding life working in multi-arts around the world, with her most recent thirty years immersed in Waldorf education.

Born the fourth of five children to a pianist-poet mother and a clarinettist-potter-writer father, Judith was not taught music as a child, but assumed for her first 16 years of life that she would be an artist, creating illustrated children's books. However, her love of choral music led to becoming a leading Australian composer, conductor and director in the field of choral music and music theatre, for which she received many awards, commissions and fellowships. Her work at the Orana Steiner School and Mt Barker Waldorf School introduced her to the philosophy of Rudolf Steiner, which continues to intrigue and inspire Judith and her work.
